Section 1. Title

This law shall be known as the "Cat Control Ordinance of the Village of Nunda".

Section 2. Purpose

The Village of Nunda has undertaken to establish this animal ordinance to protect the public health and safety of its citizens and to promote the general welfare of the citizens and animals residing within the Village. Animal ownership is encourage and welcomed within this Village, but strong emphasis is placed on responsible ownership of animals. Animal owners are encouraged to respect the rights of their fellow citizens and also those of their animals.

Section 3. Definitions

As used in this law the following terms mean:

Animal – For the purpose of this law, animal shall refer to both male and female cats.

Animal establishment – Any pet shop, grooming shop, animal auction, performing animal exhibition, kennel or animal shelter, except this term shall not include veterinary medical facilities, licensed research facilities, facilities operated by government agencies, or licensed animal dealers regulated by the USDA under the provisions of US Public Laws 89-544, 91-579, 94-279, 99-198, and 101-624.

At large – an animal shall be deemed at large when off the property of the owner and not under restraint.

Kennel – An establishment kept for the purposes of breeding, selling, or boarding animals or engaged in training animals.

Nuisance – An animal shall be considered a nuisance if it: Damages, soils, defiles, or defecates on private property other than the owner's or on public property in any park, public building, street, parking lot, alley or sidewalk unless such waste is immediately removed and properly disposed of by the owner; causes unsanitary, "dangerous", or offensive conditions; causes a disturbance by excessive noise-making; or molests, attacks, or interferes with persons or other domestic animals on public property or private property other than the owner's.

Owner – A person having the right of property or custody of an animal or who keeps or harbors an animal or knowingly permits an animal to remain on or about any premises occupied by that person or who feeds an animal whether or not the food is intended for that animal, except that this term shall not include "animal establishments" or veterinary medical facilities, licensed research facilities, facilities operated by government agencies, or licensed animal dealers regulated by the USDA under the provisions of US Public Laws 89-544, 91-579, 94-279, 99-198, and 101-624.

Person – Any individual, corporation, partnership, organization, or institution commonly recognized by law as a unit.

Pet shop – An establishment engaged in the business of buying and selling, at retail, dogs or animals or other animals for profit-making purposes.

Restraint – An animal shall be considered under restraint if it is within the real property limits of its owner or secured by a leash or lead or under the control of a responsible person.

“Dangerous” animal – An animal that without justification attacks a person or domestic animal causing physical injury or death, or behaves in a manner that a reasonable person would believe poses an unjustified imminent threat or serious injury or death to one or more persons or domestic animals.

Section 4. Owner responsibility

- (a) All animals shall be kept under restraint.
- (b) Every “dangerous” animal shall be confined by its owner within a building or secure enclosure and shall be securely muzzled or caged whenever off the premises of its owner.
- (c) No animal shall be allowed to cause a nuisance. The owner of an animal shall be held responsible for every behavior of such animal under the provisions of this law including the payment for repair of damages caused by an unrestrained animal.

Section 5. Jurisdiction

The Village Justice of the Village of Nunda shall have jurisdiction over all actions and proceedings under this law.

Section 6. Enforcement

This law shall be enforced by any peace officer when acting pursuant to his/her special duties, or law enforcement officer.

Section 7. Issuance of Appearance Tickets; Filing of Complaints

- (a) Any peace officer acting pursuant to his/her special duties, or law enforcement officer observing a violation of this law in his/her presence shall issue an appearance ticket for such violation.
- (b) Any person who observes a violation of this law in his/her presence in the village may file a signed complaint, under oath, with a Village Justice of the Village of Nunda, specifying the objectionable conduct of the cat, the date thereof, the damage caused, a

description of the cat and the name and residence, if known, of the owner or other person harboring such cat.

(c) Upon receipt by the Village Justice of the Village of Nunda of any complaint, in writing, against the conduct of any particular cat in the village, the Village Justice must summon the alleged owner or other person harboring such cat to appear in person before him/her. If the summons is disregarded, the Village Justice must permit the filing of an information and issue a warrant for the arrest of such person.

Section 8. Penalties for Offense

A violation of this law shall be deemed an offense punishable by a fine not to exceed \$50.00. Each separate offense shall constitute a separate additional violation.

Section 9. Repeals (conflicting ordinances and laws)

All other ordinances or laws of the Village of Nunda that are in conflict with this law are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 10. Severability

If any part of this law shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining parts of this ordinance.

Section 11. Applicability

This law shall be in full force and effect upon the expiration of twenty (20) days after its passage and publication.
