Mayor Cox called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Trustee Galton

Roll Call: Trustee Essler Absent

Visitor's Forum

A. Ron Duttweiler: Parking

Having received a parking ticket while parked on their own property in the right-of-way, Pastor Duttweiler read a letter written by his wife questioning the Board as to what kind of town do they want to have? What sort of feelings do they want people to have towards Nunda? The letter highlighted many aspects that make this not a nice place to live. The suggestion was made that minimally, a warning ticket could be issued.

Mayor Cox reiterated the law as it stands, stating that this is not new. No parking on streets between the hours of 2AM & 6 AM is consistent with every other community. Trustee Galton agrees with Pastor Duttweiler, stating that he feels the Parking Law should be revisited. The complaints being received are snowballing.

Clerk Gray made copies of the letter for Board members.

B. Marchelle Vianese: Vermont St. & Creek Rd. Speeding – Postponed

C. Mel Allen: Parking Law

Mr. Allen would like to see parking limited to one side of the road at Walnut & Mill Streets. Parking is problematic several evenings a week due to a neighbor's card parties. Mr. Allen also does not believe the current Parking Law to be legal. He requested a copy of the Local Law to send to the State Attorney General's Office for review.

D. Paul Claud: Veteran's Tax Exemption

Mr. Claud has waited 50 years to sign up for the Veterans' Tax Exemption only to learn that the Village of Nunda does not offer the full exemption available and adopted by other municipalities. He would like Veterans to be honored for their sacrifice given.

Trustee Galton responded that when exemptions are given, other have to pay more. Mayor Cox stated that the Board will look further into the matter.

E. Privilege of the floor given to Sheila Piper.
Ms. Piper questioned if 4 wheelers are still legal. The answer was “yes”. She then questioned if it is okay to drive in your yard. The response was “yes”. Ms. Piper expressed her interest in the regulations of the current Noise Ordinance.

Presentation

A. Richard Gray, Roy Teitsworth, Inc.

Mr. Gray explained how Equipment Turnover Programs operate. Roy Teitsworth, Inc. specializes in equipment sought after by the public and contractors. Highly successful selling municipal equipment, with minimal investment if turned over within 1-3 yrs. On-site auction incurs a 10% commission at Palmyra Auction. Charge figured differently over \$40,000. Monthly on-line auction has buyer’s premium only. Troy Bennett and Richard Gray to meet after June 21st to do an evaluation on equipment/truck inventory owned by the Village.

A. Standard Work Day and Reporting Resolution for Elected and Appointed Officials

BE IT RESOLVED that the Nunda Village Board of Trustees establishes the Standard Work Day and Reporting Resolution for Elected and Appointed Officials as presented, to be posted immediately for a period of at least 30 days in the Main Entrance of the Clerk's Office. B. Internet & Security/Camera Feed Quotes: Playground, Water Plant, DPW Garage

BE IT RESOLVED that the Nunda Village Board of Trustees approve the installation of internet service by Frontier Communications, with a 3 yr. Contract - Monthly package rate for phone & internet of \$49.98 for the Water Plant & DPW Garage, along with the installation of a phone line/DSL above Parts Plus located on East Street for the purpose of Security/Camera Feed for the Village Park at a 3 yr. contact cost of \$59.98 per month. The motion was made by Trustee Snyder, seconded by Trustee Galton. Carried 4-0.

Old Business

A. Village Property Route 408: Annexation- temporarily postponed

B. Real Property Sale to Wilma Willey: No response at this time.

Other Business

- A. Trustee Snyder stated that Trinity Church would like to do a benefit car wash at the old ambulance building. To be referred to the Town since they are the property owners.
- B. Trustee Galton questioned if any Board member was interested in reviewing the current Parking Law. Deputy Mayor Amrhein stated that he would. The Village is having a hard time with the issue of residents not being able to park on their own property in order to avoid parking in the street. In addition, folks (including the Police) are disregarding the “No Left Turn Sign” while exiting the Mall. The Board consensus is that there really isn’t a safety issue.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Nunda Village Board of Trustees approve the elimination of the designation of “Right-Turn Only” from the exit of the Mall Parking Lot. The motion was made by Trustee Galton, seconded by Deputy Mayor Amrhein. Carried 4-0.
