SUBJ: 2022-2023 BUDGET CALL

This year's budget call will begin with the continued discussion on many grants being worked on at this moment by several village officials that will continue to affect our budgeting practices in the

General, Water, and Sewer Funds. As we move into the next Fiscal Year, we need to be mindful of the Capital Improvement Project coming to a close at the Sewer Plant and initiating a debt schedule to repay the debt over a 40-year period for the users of this municipal service. Public safety is a critical component of our budgeting process and should be deliberated as to developing a plan of action to addressed sidewalk replacement, municipal parking enhancements and village mall area upgrades. Dialogue continues on healthcare costs and industry standards as these matters will need to be reviewed. Any/all final decision making on budgetary matters will be made on an executive level.

Pursuant to New York State Village Law §5-502, on or before the eighth day of February in each year, or such other date as may be applicable pursuant to section 5-510 of Village Law, the budget officer shall give written notification to the head of each administrative unit that he shall submit estimates, schedules, and statements as hereinafter provided. The municipalities Standard Operating Procedures for the Annual Operating Budget Cycle will be provided in February 2021 to act as a guidance defining the purpose of the procedures, scope, responsibilities, and calendar of events. A Detailed Report of Revenues and a Detailed Report of Expenditures will also be provided to each administrative unit head along with a printout of each *funds* accounting codes to assist each administrative head with the creation of their tentative budgets.

On or before March 1st of each year, the head of each administrative unit **must submit** an estimate of revenues and expenditures of the administrative unit for the ensuing fiscal year to the Clerk-Treasurer. This estimate should show all sources of all revenue, itemize the character and object of each expenditure, as defined in Village Law §5-500(7), and contain such additional information as the Clerk-Treasurer may prescribe. A review of our current five-year capital equipment plan must take place to better manage our budgetary requirements and necessary equipment needs. Should there be any questions with the process, procedures or due dates, please do not hesitate to contact the Clerk-Treasurer.

B. Brief on current or upcoming projects each organization is engaged in - shared services

KCS

Board Vice President Lowell discussed the SRO, salary of \$80,000 annually, and the many contributions their officer provides not only to the school but to the community.

Visitor-Sal NiCastro intervened with praise for the SRO and the success, discipline and openness of having this member of KCS. Would **not** recommend cutting this position.

Board President Galton provided information on KCS Capital Projects with ending dates and additional projects coming in the future. School debt because of these projects was also mentioned.

TOWN

Supervisor Walker discussed the new Highway Building and the process of completing this project. Also, adding LED lighting to the Hamlet of Dalton is in their scope of work to be completed this year. Deputy Supervisor Forrester stated with the implementation of this lighting it should be paid off within two years.

Supervisor Walker also mentioned culvert work on McGinty Road in the town to be completed with funding received to cover the cost of work and materials.

ARPA funding is being discussed and will help support the cost of water and sewer services installed at the new Town Highway Building. Town debt was also mentioned related to the new building to include funding received from former State Senator Young to help offset costs of the project.

VILLAGE

Mayor Morgan listed several projects the village is working on; Community Development Block Grant totaling \$500K to help local families with upgrades to their residence, Mural Project where additional funding is being worked on to create added murals to the display located on North State Street in the village, Sewer Plant upgrades totaling \$3.2M dollars with approximately \$800K received in grant funding. Land Acquisition Grant for the purchase of 174 acres to protect the source water for the municipality is winding down. This was a \$300K, 75/25 split grant with the municipality portion of the grant hopefully being paid down using ARPA funding received through the American Recovery Act sign by President Biden in March of 2021. Land Mark Society Grant a shared grant with the Town is providing information on homes in the community that meet historical significance within our community. This program should be wrapping up this year through the identification of these properties. Lastly, Mayor Morgan stated through Liv. Co. a county-wide initiative is bringing in an artist to paint a large mural in Nunda to be presented to the public in July 2022.

C. Public Safety for students and residents-sidewalks, crosswalks and crossing guards

Much discussion on traffic safety and public safety for both our local student population and way finders took place between all three boards. Installation of sidewalks from Rymer Fields back to KCS is and has been a significant concern. The village has submitted on two occasions back to NYSDOT (grant submissions) efforts to have these sidewalks placed on South Walnut Street to no avail. Continued work on this will need to be started again.

D. Tax Abatement-Village & KCS

Mayor Morgan stated he wanted this subject approached through committee format with KCS Board members and Village Board members meeting to discuss at a later date.

E. Continuing COVID-19 concerns from each organization's perspective

KCS

Board President Galton stated the school was following NYS laws on mask mandates and all other requirements related to COVID-19.

TOWN

Supervisor Walker stated the town still has COVID-19 test kits available to the public for distribution.

VILLAGE

Mayor Morgan stated the village was following protocols/regulations as we are located in a town building.

At 7:58 PM Board President Galton thanked both village and town boards for the invite and dialogue. As there were no other items for discussion with the school board the school board left the meeting at 7:59 PM.

F. Joint Town/Village Police Department discussion

Trustee Allen stated he was withdrawing his proposal for a fulltime police officer. Chief Dale stated he is working out a plan to move forward with the staffing he has for our Police Department. Chief Dale also stated he is looking at having more days of coverage throughout the year and a varying of times when officers are on call. Chief Dale distributed annual Police Reports.

Supervisor Walker thanked Chief for doing the best he can do with what he has. Chief Dale stated he is looking for sustainability of the department.

Deputy Mayor Snyder stated there should be better continuity with a smaller force. Deputy Mayor Snyder provided the significant increase in calls this department has taken over the past decade.

Mayor Morgan and Trustee Allen both thanked Chief Dale for his continued commitment and dedication to Nunda.




