ADOPTING LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2025 ENTITLED, “OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT
ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW §3-C”

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Nunda met at a Public Hearing and Regular Board meeting at the Village Offices located in the Village of Nunda, New York on the 14th day of April, 2025, commencing at 6:00 p.m., at which time and place the following members were:

WHEREAS, all Board Members, having due notice of said meeting, and that pursuant to Article 7, §104 of the Public Officers Law, said meeting was open to the general public and due and proper notice of the time and place whereof was given as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board is considering a local law that will override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Village of Nunda; and

WHEREAS, a resolution was duly adopted by the Village Board of the Village of Nunda on March 31, 2025, authorizing a public hearing to held by the Village Board on April 14, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. at the Village Offices to hear all interested parties on said proposed local law; and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly advertised in the Hornell Tribune, the official newspaper of said Village and posted conspicuously in six public locations around the village; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was held on March 31, 2025, at the Village Offices in the Village of Nunda commencing at 6:00 p.m. and all parties in attendance were permitted an opportunity to speak on behalf of or in opposition to said proposed local law, or any part thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Nunda, after due deliberation, finds it in the best interest of said Village to adopt said local law.

RESOLVED, that the Village Board of the Village of Nunda hereby adopts Local Law No. 1 of 2025, entitled, “Override the Tax Levy Limit Established in General Municipal Law §3-c.”; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk be and she hereby is directed to enter said local law in the minutes of this meeting and give due notice of the adoption of said local law to the Secretary of the State of New York.
